Robert Z. Orlowski, MD, PhD Florence Maude Thomas Cancer Research Professor, Director, Myeloma Section Departments of Lymphoma/Myeloma and Experimental Therapeutics Division of Cancer Medicine The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center Houston, TX

Robert Z. Orlowski, MD, PhD, is Professor in the Departments of Lymphoma/ Myeloma and Experimental Therapeutics, Division of Cancer Medicine, at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas. He is also Principle Investigator of the MD Anderson Specialized Programs of Research Excellence (SPORE) in Multiple Myeloma, and Chair of the Southwest Oncology Group (SWOG) Myeloma Committee.

Dr. Orlowski earned his doctoral degree in molecular biophysics and biochemistry from Yale University, and his medical degree from the Yale University School of Medicine. He completed his internship and residency in internal medicine at Barnes Hospital at the Washington University in St. Louis School of Medicine. He completed his fellowships in Medical Oncology and Adult Hematology at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland.

Dr. Orlowski has published numerous book chapters, articles, and abstracts on cancer therapy, with a focus on the molecular pathogenesis of oncologic disease processes and the mechanisms of action of chemotherapeutics. His clinical research efforts focus on the translation of promising laboratorybased findings into novel clinical trials for patients with hematologic malignancies. Dr. Orlowski has published in, and is a reviewer for, several journals including *Blood*, *Cancer Research*, *Journal of Clinical Oncology*, and the *New England Journal of Medicine*. He has received several awards, including The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society Scholar in Clinical Research and the Jefferson-Pilot Fellowship in Academic Medicine.



LLS provides a limited amount of financial assistance to help patients with significant financial need who are under a doctor's care for a confirmed blood cancer diagnosis. Before applying for patient financial aid, find out if you are eligible for the Co-Pay Assistance Program, which may offer a larger amount of financial support (see above).
